Student Services Center (SSC)

New and continuing students can find plenty of assistance when they walk through the "front door" of College of DuPage. Here you will find representatives from Admissions and Outreach, Student Financial Assistance, Student Registration Services, Career Services, Veterans Services, and Center for Access and Accommodations. You will also find academic counselors and advisors, and Campus Central, with representatives who can answer your questions and point you in the right direction. Need a cup of coffee or a snack? Stop by Starbucks on the second floor. Student Life, home to more than 60 clubs and student organizations, is on the first floor. You can also have your Student Photo ID taken here or hang out in the Student Life Lounge.

Student Resource Center (SRC)


You will always find students coming and going in the Student Resource Center. The first floor includes Continuing Education, the Bookstore, Cafeteria and WDCB Radio. The SRC is also home to Learning Commons, a one-stop academic support center. On the second floor, you will find the Jack H. Turner Conference Center, Records Office and the Library's main entrance. There is another entrance to the Library on the SRC third floor along with the Academic Computing Center.

Berg Instructional Center (BIC)

Named after College of DuPage's founding President, Dr. Rodney K. Berg, the BIC contains classrooms and faculty offices. On every floor of the BIC you can find space to relax and study in a variety of Student Commons areas, along with vending machines for snacking. You will also find the Testing Center and Cashier's Office on the second floor, while the Honors Program, *Courier* Newspaper, and Field and Experiential/Study Abroad offices are on the third floor. The building also houses labs for Bio-Anthropology, Math, Engineering CADD, Geology and Hydroscience, Forecast and Meteorology.

Homeland Security Education Center (HEC)

The Homeland Security Education Center houses the Criminal Justice and Fire Science programs, the Police Department, Homeland Security Training Institute and the Suburban Law Enforcement Academy. This comprehensive, multijurisdictional training center includes a full-scale indoor street scene for force-on-force exercises, forensics and cybercrimes labs, a command center designed to instruct National Incident Management System protocols, a smoke room with moveable walls for EMS and fire rescue simulations, a fully functional mock courtroom, a full-size ambulance and an outdoor scaling and rappelling tower. Also, as you walk through this building you will witness a piece of history. College of DuPage was selected as one of the few educational facilities in the U.S. to receive a relic from the Twin Towers following 9/11. It is a ceiling beam and weighs more than 1,000 pounds.

Homeland Security Training Center (HTC)

The Homeland Security Training Center includes a state-of-the-art indoor firing range and a 911 call center training lab. The firing range, which measures 100 feet by 50 yards, features 24 target positions, running man targets and a simulator to replicate a variety of scenarios for both proximity and tactical training. Squad cars can be driven into the range to teach police cadets how to properly and safely approach suspects and vehicles. The facility also contains several multi-purpose classrooms, a 911 call center training room for employees working at dispatch centers, and a cutting-edge VirTra V-300 firearms simulator.

Institutional Resource Center (IRC)

The Institutional Resource Center (IRC) was repurposed and remodeled in 2019 to house administrative offices for Marketing and Communications Department, Planning and Institutional Effectiveness Department, Support Services Division and Procurement Division.

Technical Education Center (TEC)

The Technical Education Center houses the Architecture, Interior Design, Horticulture, Automotive Technology, Computer-Aided Design, Construction Management, Electro-Mechanical Technology, HVAC, Manufacturing Technology and Welding Technology programs. The TEC includes 31 classrooms, 16 state-of-the-art laboratories, including a greenhouse, as well as space for raw materials and vehicular storage. The LEED-certified center was designed with sustainability in mind and features two windmills and four solar panels on its roof.



Physical Education Center (PEC)

The Physical Education Center has a visible and vibrant main entrance to welcome students and the community with an open lobby area and concession area. Interested in working out? The Chaparral Fitness Center includes a stretching area, spinning room, cardiovascular/fitness room and areas for group fitness programs along with monitors and sound system. There is a competitive swimming pool, along with scoreboards and a running track in the arena. If you are a student-athlete, the 14,000 square-foot Varsity Athletic room includes men's and women's locker rooms, a strength lab and training room for all Chaparral athletes to enjoy.

Seaton Computing Center (SCC)


The Seaton Computing Center is home to Computer and Information Science, Computer and Information Technology and Office Technology Information programs. The SCC's spaces have been updated, and its center structured into specialized clusters that include high-tech classrooms, a visual and simulation lab, networking hardware labs, a server/internetworking lab, software/web development labs and end-user labs.

Health and Science Center (HSC)

The Health and Science Center is a leading-edge home to programs that include Nursing, Dental Hygiene, Diagnostic Medical Imaging, Physical Therapist Assistant and Surgical Technology. Inside the HSC you will discover a CT scanner, an operating room, full dental lab, medical imaging laboratories, and a "SIM Hospital" containing four private rooms, an operational nurse's station, a simulation de-briefing room and use of high-fidelity manikins. The Simulation Center includes a home setting; long-term care/rehabilitation environment; and a clinic setting.

Culinary & Hospitality Center (CHC)

The McAninch Arts Center is home to Theater, Music, Art, Photography, Motion Picture/Television and Graphic Design. The MAC front entrance was updated with a new canopy and glass panels so it maintains visual consistency with other buildings on campus. The Ticket Office was relocated to a more visible location, eliminating cramped lines for patrons. There is also a new concession and bar area in the lobby. The Cleve Carney Museum of Art was added to showcase regional and national contemporary artists, including the Friday Kahlo, Timeless exhibition in summer of 2021, while the Performance Hall includes updated seating and wall treatments, a new HVAC system and improved acoustics to make your experience one you won't forget. And out back, an amphitheater with tiered lawn seating for 1,000 will allow patrons to enjoy the arts outdoors.

Culinary & Hospitality Center (CHC)

This Culinary & Hospitality Center houses the Hospitality Administration and Culinary Arts programs. You can enjoy a meal at Wheat Café, a student-run casual dining room with an adjacent Culinary Market and Bake Shop that sells pastries and meals prepared by Culinary Arts students. The CHC also houses the Inn at Water's Edge, a six-room boutique hotel, and Silverleaf, a multipurpose meeting room. There are Skills Kitchens, Fine-Dining and Casual Dining Kitchens, a Chocolate Room for Pastry Arts, and a Culinary Amphitheatre for lectures/cooking demonstrations.

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
COD Centers





Carol Stream Center


