

GALAPAGOS ISLANDS ADVENTURE

*Sea Kayaking, Mountain Biking, Hiking, Snorkeling and Wildlife Encounters
Friday, Feb. 12 to Sunday, Feb. 21, 2010*



Travel back in time to the days of Charles Darwin.

Visit Darwin's Research Center, the Giant Tortoises Rearing Center and the World Heritage City of Quito, Ecuador. Kayak among the islands while viewing sea turtles, iguanas, penguins and blue-footed boobies. Snorkel with sea lions, visit giant tortoises, bike through farmland and local villages and hike to a volcanic rim, the second-highest in the world. This multi-adventure is perfect for either first-time or experienced paddlers and hikers.

The 10-day adventure is a wildlife lover's paradise,

offering up close and personal wildlife viewing. The cost of \$4,360 includes round trip air to Quito and to the Galapagos Islands, inter-island transport by motor boat, all airport transfers, all ground transportation, nine nights hotel, all kayak and snorkeling equipment, bikes, instruction, some meals, Research and Interpretation Center fees, park permits and local English-speaking guides. One credit of tuition is extra. A deposit of \$500 secures your place on the trip.
