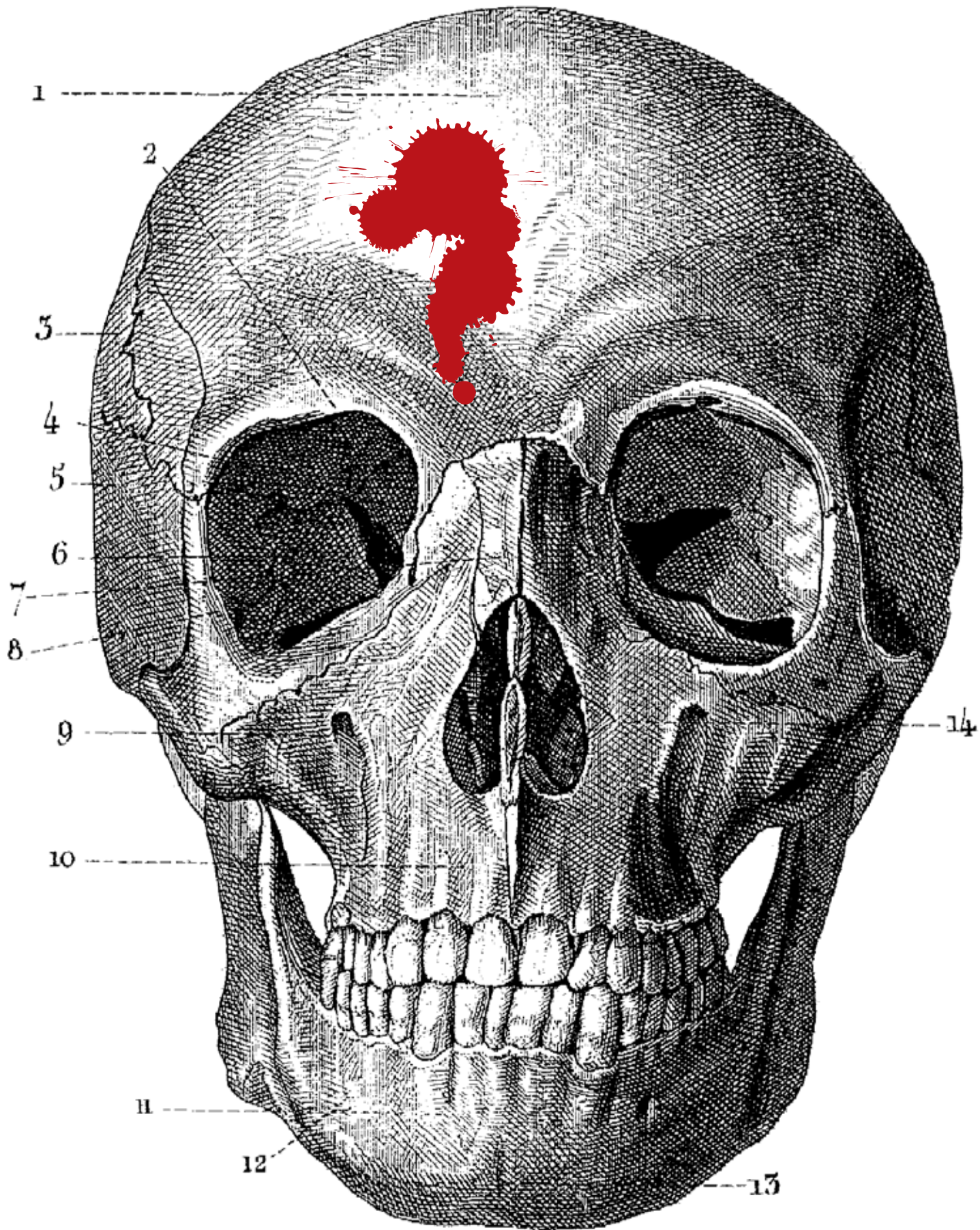


TAPHONOMY:
