Travel from Yucatan's eastern coastal town of Tulum to  
Merida on the west coast, and back to Playa del Carmen.

Explore by bus and excursions, including two-to-four  
miles of walking over easy-to-moderate terrain per  
hike, a short bicycle ride, a boat ride, easy kayaking  
in mangroves, and time on the beach.

Class meetings are on Wednesdays from 7 to 9 p.m. on  
Feb. 3 and 24, March 10 and April 14. The fee of \$2,245  
includes roundtrip airfare, land transportation in Yucatan,  
all entry fees, excursions, upscale lodging, most meals  
and a bilingual guide. Tuition is extra. The last date  
to register is Wednesday, Dec. 9, 2009.
