General Education Requirements

Each candidate for an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) in Cosmetology shall satisfactorily complete 18 credits in General Education.

A.A.S. Degree Requirements

A minimum of 2 credits must be completed from the list of courses in the Global/Multicultural Studies or Contemporary Life Skills category. Courses taken under Program Requirements or General Education can satisfy this requirement.
