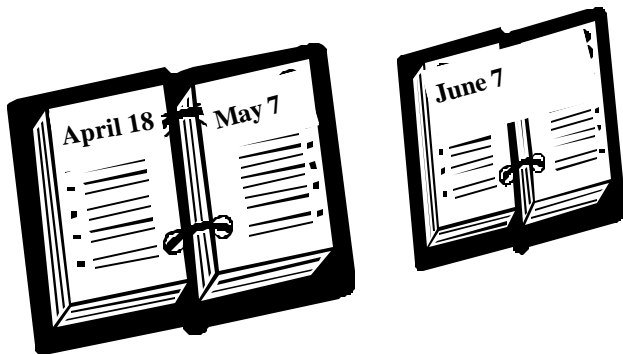
GLOBAL TERRORISM
