After logging-in, students can add or drop classes, view grades, print their schedules and pay tuition.

Prereqs verified with class sign-up

Students will not be able to register for fall semester classes unless they have met the pre-enrollment criteria.

Criteria are minimum requirements to help students succeed academically. COD verifies the prerequisites during the registration process.

Students should send their high school and college transcripts to COD to verify that prerequisites have been met.

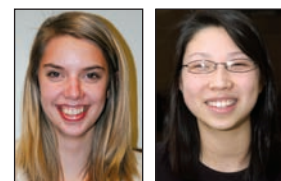
Students also need to take multiple placement tests for reading competency, English and math.

While the reading competency test is valid indefinitely the English and math tests are valid for one year from the testing date.

ON-CAMPUS SERVICES

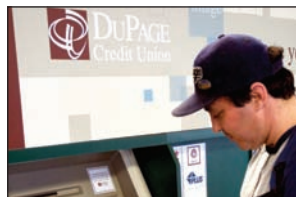
The DuPage Credit Union has an office on campus. The office is located in Building CU on the north side of the Berg Instructional Center and offers full service including checking, savings and loan.

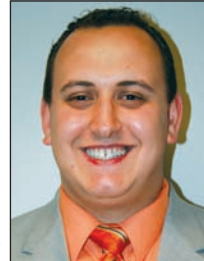
Zoubi voice of students as trustee
