

How do College of DuPage’s enrollment patterns compare with other Illinois community colleges? Data provided by the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) reveal a variety of enrollment changes. Of the 48 community colleges in Illinois, 21 colleges experienced increases in headcount, while 20 exhibited decreases during the past year—College of DuPage being one of them with 1.7% decrease for Fall Quarter 2004 over the previous Fall Quarter. Overall, statewide community college enrollment numbers decreased slightly (-0.6%) from the Fall of 2003. The table below displays the Fall Term **credit** headcount and the percent of change over the past three years of community colleges in the Chicago-land area.
