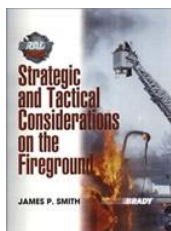

COURSE DESCRIPTION

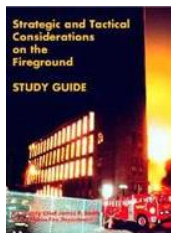
Principles of coordinating fire ground tactics by the utilization of manpower and equipment. Various fire situations are presented for analysis and evaluation.
