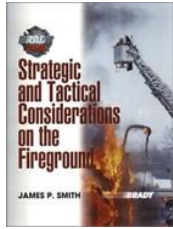
### COURSE DESCRIPTION

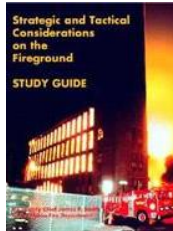

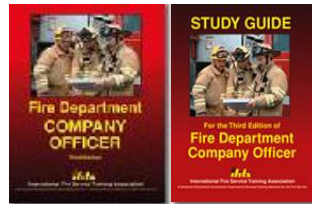
