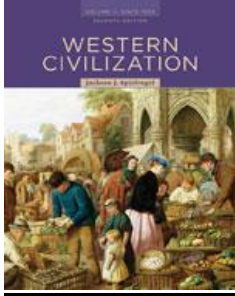
Western Civilization since 1600
