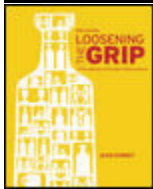
Introduction to Addictions

COURSE DESCRIPTION

An overview of historical and cultural, and current attitudes toward alcohol use; the model of alcoholism and other addictions; systems applications of the addictions model; the interaction of physical, psychological, social, and spiritual aspects of addiction; the clinical manifestations, methods, and models of treatment; an overview of various concepts of early intervention and prevention are explored. (4 credit hours)
