ACCELERATED DEGREE PROGRAM FOR ADULTS**

PROGRAM INFORMATION SHEET

The **Accelerated Degree Program for Adults (ADPA)** is designed for adults who are working full-time and want to earn a **bachelor's degree** in a non-traditional format. The **major is Organizational Management**. The degree is 128 semester hours.

The Curriculum:

General Education Core	37 semester hours
<i>Communication skills:</i>	<i>English I, English II, Speech Communication</i>
<i>Humanities:</i>	<i>3 courses; 9 semester hours</i>
<i>Social Science:</i>	<i>3 courses; 9 semester hours: Macroeconomics is required</i>
<i>Mathematics:</i>	<i>3 semester hours above Intermediate Algebra</i>
<i>Natural Science:</i>	<i>2 courses: one biological science; one physical science (one lab course)</i>
Support Courses	5 semester hours
<i>World Studies</i>	<i>1 course; 3 semester hours multicultural or non-western emphasis</i>
<i>Health and wellness</i>	<i>2 semester hours health or wellness</i>
Mission-specific courses(theology)	9 semester hours
Organizational Management major	39 semester hours
Electives/Credit for Prior Learning	38 semester hours

Admission Requirements:

1. Completion of Application to the program.
2. Documentation of two years full-time work experience outside the home.
3. Completion of at least 30 semester hours of college course work, including English Composition I with a grade of C or above.
4. Submission of official transcripts from all colleges attended. The most recent transcript must indicate that the students was in good academic standing and earned at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale.

Major: The **Organizational Management major** is offered in a cohort style. Students begin classes with a specific group and move through the 39-semester hour major in approximately 18 months. Classes meet one time a week for four hours. Additional courses needed for the completion of the degree may be taken concurrently while a student is completing the major, or after the student has completed the major.
