One additional science course with or without a lab

- Choose **one**: IAI approved science course with or without lab

Social and Behavioral Sciences—9 credits

- PSYCH 1100—General Psychology
- POLI 1101—American Politics
- Choose **one**: HISTO 1130—History of U.S. to 1865, **OR** History 1140—History of U.S. since 1865, **OR** HIST 2260—History of U.S. Since 1945

Humanities/Fine Arts—9 credits

- ENGLI 1130—Intro to Literature
- IAI approved Fine Arts
- Choose **one**: PHILO 1100, 1110, 1150, 1145, REL 1100, 1110, 1120, 1150 **OR** 1155

Education Specialty Courses—9 credits

- EDUC 1100—Intro to Education (required)
- PSYCH 2230—Developmental Psychology: Childhood (required))

Choose one (only) of the following three courses:

- PSYCH 2220—Educational Psychology (preferred)
- PSYCH 2233—Developmental Psychology: Adolescence (required only for middle grade endorsement)
- EDUC 2201—Education of Exceptional Children

Notes:

- Concentration **or** Minor required for certification. Concentration: Minimum of 18 credit hours in **any one** department or program. See North Central catalog for details. **~or~** Minor: Minimum of 18 credit hours. No restriction on subject area choice of a minor; students can choose any existing NCC minor. See North Central catalog for details
- A passing score on the Illinois Basic Skills Test is required for admission to the Education Program. Student should take this test before transferring to North Central
- GPA 2.5 (minimum); a 2.7 GPA in professional education courses is required for student teaching
- If pursuing an Associate in Arts Degree, include course(s) to fulfill COD International/Intercultural Studies and Human Relations requirements
- An Associate Degree is not required to transfer to North Central
