Notes:

1. This agreement will be honored for four years starting from and including the student's start year at COD in 2007-2008 or 2008-2009.
2. The following requirements are met by transferable courses: DC 201, DC 205, DC 210, DC 215, DC 220, DC 275. Three of the MPTV electives must be 1220, to fulfill DC 225; 1311, to fulfill ANI 101; and 1822, to fulfill DC 270. All IAI approved GE courses transfer.
3. COD students would have no major electives required in their program at DePaul.
4. The Bridge courses are listed in addition to the AAS degree. COD students should take 4 more GE courses (referred to as bridge courses) while at COD. However, if students wish to take the additional GE courses after they transfer to DePaul, they may do so, understanding that it will take more than 2 years to finish the degree program.

Understanding the Past (UP)	2 Courses Required (each from a different category)
<p>Two additional Liberal Studies courses, each from different learning domains. Must complete a total of 20 liberal studies courses including the 8-credit hour Mathematical and Technological Literacy requirement, which is both ISP120 and ISP121. ISP121 will replace one course from any one of the six Learning Domains as long as you take at least one course in each domain.</p>
