The sketchbook will be the vessel for your research and design explorations throughout the semester. Use your sketchbook to record and organize your research and design ideas. Your sketchbook should be a complete and thorough snapshot of the research and ideas you have explored during the class, and should include information from all of the assignments. Recorded items can include assigned and supplemental explorations, sketches, diagrams and written records.

For full credit your sketchbook must include the following:

- 1) Notes and Sketches from all of the class reading discussions
- 2) Sketches, Process, Diagrams and records from all of the assignments in this course.

 - c. Site Analysis
 - d. Education Center Pavilion (process for all studies)
 - e. Detail Study
