3 rafters saved; one hospitalized

An almost week-long trip to freedom ended for three Cuban men Thursday when they were rescued by the Coast Guard after their inner tube was spotted off Boynton Beach.

"There were five of us. We separated," said Ivan Candelario Gonzalez Rodriguez, 27, who was brought to the Port of Palm Beach with his brother, Jesus, 31, and Martin Ruiz Rodriguez, 25.

The three sunburned men from Havana were taken by ambulance to St. Mary's Hospital in West Palm Beach. They left behind the tube, nets and oars with shark-bite marks.

Jesus Gonzalez was severely dehydrated, the Coast Guard reported. He was in critical condition in the hospital's intensive care unit. The others were to be transported to Krome Detention Center.
