

Human Services Associate in Applied Science - College of DuPage to Bachelor of Arts in Human Services - Dominican University Transfer Guide

- A minimum of 120 hours must be completed to earn the degree. Students can transfer in up to 90 hours, including a maximum of 68 hours from a community college.
- An individual course may not be used to satisfy multiple requirements.

Bachelor of Arts in Human Services/Master of Arts in Conflict Resolution
