



Enhanced 2+2 Agreement between College of DuPage and Lewis University leading to a **Bachelor of Arts degree in Middle Level Education in Math.**

Who Can Enroll in the Program?

- Students who have completed an associate's degree with the specific required courses. (See specific course list on the reverse side)
- New students interested in completing a Bachelor of Arts degree in Middle Level Education in Math from Lewis University in partnership with COD.
- Students who graduated from COD and went elsewhere can be considered for the program if they complete an associate's degree with the required courses. A transcript evaluation needs to be completed by both schools.

Program Overview

- This program results in a bachelor's degree in Middle Level Education in Math. Graduates of the program are eligible to apply for a state of Illinois Professional Educator License with an endorsement in Middle Level Education in Math.
- The first semester of Lewis University classes are held on the COD campus.
- All required field experiences for Lewis University courses are assigned by Lewis.
- Lewis University College of Education programs are approved by the Illinois State Board of Education.
- With this 2+2 program, students pay College of DuPage tuition for College of DuPage courses.
- Lewis University courses are offered at a significantly reduced tuition rate.

- It is important for students to choose electives to maximize their opportunity to achieve an associate's degree
- College of DuPage students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75/4.0 scale before enrolling in any Lewis University Education courses
- The Illinois State Board of Education requires teaching candidates to pass the Test of Academic Proficiency or meet ACT/SAT requirements. While this is not an admission requirement of any of these education programs, it is highly recommended that candidates attempt these tests as soon as possible.

ACT:

Prior to 9/1/15 - Composite score of 22 or higher and a minimum score of 19 on the Combined Combined English/Writing portion

9/1/15 to 9/9/16 - Composite score of 22 or higher and a minimum score of 16 on the Writing portion

9/10/16 and later - Composite score of 22 or higher and a minimum score of 6 on the Writing portion

SAT:

Prior to 3/5/16 - Composite score of 1030 (critical reading +mathematics = 1030 or higher) and a minimum of 450 on writing

3/5/16 and later - Composite score of 1110 (evidence-based reading a writing + mathematics = 1110 or higher) and a minimum score of 26 on writing and language.
