	1.	Contact Dr. Lan Li, the coordinator of Hospitality and Tourism Management Program to review previous community college course work/transcripts and to construct your plan to complete the B.S. in Hospitality and Tourism Management degree.
	2.	Have completed, or be working towards completion of, a Hospitality-oriented Associate of Applied Science degree at a community college. (See next page for additional information.)
	3.	Complete an application for admission online (\$40 application fee), submit official copies of academic transcripts, to the NIU Office of Admissions (www.niu.edu/admissions/apply). The NIU Transfer Center can be contacted at (800) 892-3050 or transfercenter@niu.edu .
	4.	Work with your community college advisor to select the best General Education and Hospitality and Tourism Management prerequisite courses, some of which can be included in your AAS program.

2. AAS Degree in a Event Management Area of Study

Up to 30 semesters hours of credit from an approved Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree may be applied toward the BS in Hospitality and Tourism Management degree-completion program, with the consent of the department advisor. Students may receive up to additional 30 hours of cost-free NIU credit (proficiency credit) in recognition of prior learning completed within an approved AAS program. The following **College of DuPage** AAS degree has been approved for admission into the BS-Hospitality and Tourism Management program, and for prior learning credit.
