
Assignment:

Concept:

The design uses the concept of discovery as a means to make the viewer curious and move toward the end. This is accomplished by including tall hedges to limit the views into creating glimpses of the next space. This creates a memorable space to be enjoyed. The Spring space uses roofing to both allow protection from the elements while also bringing in the sun; the Summer space brings in even more sun while the Fall space resembles a tree-like roofing pattern further reinforced by the tree placement.


Concept:
