
Objective: Design an entry zone, path and flexible space for students and faculty to gather.













SPATIAL SEQUENCE






Objective: To create an abstract sculpture to express an architect's concept for a specific building using concrete, metal, wood and glass.

Solution: Researched Peter Zumthor's Therme Vals and how he blended the line between landscape and architecture. The wood represents the building imitating the natural landscape and the importance of framing views. The wooden box is tilted to imitate a mountain, and to encourage viewers to wander around the sclupture in order to see through it. The glass represents the pools that exist in the Bath House. The aluminum represents the skylights that separate the units within his design. The concrete represents the natural locally sourced stone that Zumthor used throughout his design.












Objective: To use photography and sketches to show inspiration from cities. Then intergrate those photographs and sketches into an abstract sculpture representing cities.






Solution: Highlight the different characteristics of water and how they contrast each other through layering circulation patterns that vary in complexity.







