
PROJECT DESCRIPTION: To create a still life composition using crafted three-dimensional shapes. Through light and shadows create orthographic freehand drawings to express the design.



















PLAN OBLIQUE **ELEVATION**















PROJECT DESCRIPTION: To create a public gathering space that responds to the sourrounding nature located on the College of DuPage Campus.








PROJECT DESCRIPTION: To design three spaces that were unique to the three seasons: Spring, Summer and Fall. Each space was designed using a kit of parts and a continuous path to ensure a unified composition.


concept: The design is based on a long path that is explored through discovery. The path is framed by shrubbery of various heights to control the user's views. Each season is expressed through sun patterns. Triangular roofs define the entrance of each space. Fall begins the sequence located at the west end. Framing a view of the sunset. The summer space contains the largest area for shade. Summer is associated with heat, so the summer space maintains comfort for the visitors. Spring is located at the east end of the sequence. Framing a view of the sunrise.















PROJECT DESCRIPTION: To create a composition using hand-drawn sketches, photographs, text and materials to create a sense if architectural inspiration.
























ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CENTER



This center provides spaces that include: an entrance, staff office, restrooms, cafe area, an educational wing and multipurpose space.


CONCEPT: This building follows this idea of connecting to nature. The sloped roof creates of directionality towards the prairie and the pond. The main circulation is centered around a trellised courtyard with the prairie coming through the ground and doubling as an occupiable space. This allows the visitors to appreciate nature inside and outside of the building.




















































STUDY PARTI DIAGRAMS


LIGHT WALL & SPACE

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: To create an interesting composition that evoke an emotion through the use of light and then create a space responding to the light wall.

CONCEPT (Light Wall): This light wall is designed to create an atmosphere of relaxation. The cool-toned colors represent tranquility, complemented by the soft curve of the panels. The light that penetrates through the wall illuminate the room with color and dynamic light patterns for the visitors to appreciate.





























NEIGHBORHOOD + PARK

ARCH 2202-ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN II | PROFESSOR: MARK PEARSON | SPRING 2020 | DURATION: 12 WEEKS

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: To design a community resource center that provides a welcoming space for the surrounding neighborhood. Through a populated street corner, the community resource center houses gathering spaces, a technology center, a child care drop-off, tutoring spaces, a cafe, and support offices.

CONCEPT: A community resource center that connects the neighborhood and the park. The glass facade and the atrium welcome the community and create a sense of familiarity. The neighborhood is defined by gathering spaces on the inside and outside of the building. Transitioning inside the building represents an escape from the active neighborhood. The use of a green roof, a green wall and an outdoor terrace allows the neighborhood to connect to nature. The community can come together within this space from the busy street corner to the serene side of the park.
